OPEL BLITZ TRUCK/ MAULTIER HALF-TRACK ASSEMBLY AND PAINTING GUIDE



With armoured half-tracks never being available in the numbers required, the Wehrmacht relied on horse-drawn carts and fleets of trucks to move their materiel around – the most iconic being the Opel Blitz. The Blitz is the classic German truck, seen in virtually every war film crammed with German soldiers and was used throughout the war on all fronts. It gave sterling service whether ferrying up much needed supplies to the front line, transporting troops to their posting or pulling artillery pieces into position.

The Maultier (Mule) version of the Blitz replaced the rear wheels with tracks from captured British Universal Carriers or obsolete Panzer I tanks. This gave the truck a fighting chance of crossing the cloying mud and deep snows on the inhospitable Eastern Front.

This splendid plastic kit allows you to build either the wheeled Blitz or the halftracked Maultier. In addition you have options on canvas canopy, side panels, open canopy and even acetate windows should you choose to include them on your model! That's not all - we have also included a set of ten German soldiers, seated and ready to be ferried to the front lines...

Follow this simple guide to building your German Opel Blitz truck or Maultier half-track transport.

Carefully remove each component from the frame with clippers or a craft knife. Trim off excess plastic before assembling. Test fit all parts before applying glue.

We recommend using polystyrene cement to assemble the kit, and to use this in a well-ventilated area.

Keep tools, glues, paints and small components away from children. Warlord Games recommend this kit for ages 14 and over.

DECAL APPLICATION GUIDE

- Apply a coat of gloss varnish to the areas that will receive the decal and allow this to dry fully.
- Cut out a decal from the sheet and soak it in luke warm water for 2-3 minutes.
- Once the design has started to separate from the backing paper, use tweezers or a wet paintbrush to slide the design into place on the model.
- •Use a tisue to dab away any excess water from the model, and allow to dry.
- Apply a coat of matt varnish to seal the decal in place.

PASSENGERS

Assemble the passengers and place them on the benches of your vehicle.



Please note that the legs, arms and weapons are best fitted as shown on the assembly diagram below.

Heads and extra equipment can be fitted as desired.

The passengers frame contains: 1: Head in covered stahlhelm (most suitable for Waffen-SS and Heer) 2: Head in field cap (suitable for all German infantry) 3: Head in stahlhelm (suitable for all German infantry) 4: Upper bodies A 5-9: Legs for bodies A 10: Upper bodies B

11-15: Legs for bodies B

Weapons and arms for bodies A: 16: Kar 98K rifle 17: Kar 98K rifle and left arm 18: Kar 98K rifle and left arm 19: Kar 98K rifle 20: MG42 light machine gun Weapons and arms for bodies B:
